2026 KKC Teacher Fellowship program

Keizai Koho Center (KKC), in cooperation with the National Association of Japan-America Societies (NAJAS), will offer the "KKC Study Tour to Japan 2026" for North American social studies teachers.

Dates of the Program

June 22 (Mon) -June 30 (Tue), 2026 (tentative) The contents will be developed to provide vivid and enjoyable experiences which may include:

- Visits to Japanese schools and Japanese companies
- Meetings with scholars and/or experts on social, economic, political, and international issues and the education system
- Cultural and fun experiences
- A symposium with an audience of business people, educators, etc.

Costs covered by KKC

KKC provides round trip air transportation from the participants' home city to Tokyo, as well as accommodations, ground transportation, and meals associated with the program.

The cost of insurance premiums covering overseas travel, medical and accident expenses are not covered by KKC.

Eligibility

To be eligible, applicants must:

- Have skills and experience in developing curriculum and a strong interest in Japan.
- Have never lived in Japan nor visited Japan on a similar study tour.
- Be middle or high school classroom teachers of Economics, Social Studies, Geography or History (grades 6-12).
- Be able to attend the full itinerary.
 (Cancellations and changes made after the air ticket is issued will be paid by the Applicant)
- · Be able to work and cooperate with others.
- \cdot Be open and flexible.

Requirements

To participate in the Study Tour, applicants are required to agree to:

- Make a presentation and contribute to discussions at a symposium organized as a part of the program.
- Submit a lesson plan on contemporary Japan for their classroom to KKC by Oct. 31, 2026.
- Submit a final report to KKC by January 9, 2027, which describes how experiences and findings from the tour are used in the classroom and other occasions. Relevant copies of any school newspaper/magazine articles are appreciated.
- Consent that the lesson plans and the final reports become the property of KKC to be posted on its website for use by other teachers.
- Understand that the demands of the itinerary are such that only individuals physically able to travel without special assistance should consider participating, and that special diets cannot be provided.
- Understand there will be no provisions for spouses to accompany fellows due to the nature of the program and logistical arrangements.
- Write an article for the KKC Fellowship Newsletter, which is published twice a year.

How to Apply

Application portal opens in late November.

<u>Applications must include all required documents</u> and be submitted no later than <u>February 14, 2026</u>. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

1. Required Documents

- (1) Resume: A list of your current academic position, educational achievements, and professional activities. Provide details regarding previous curriculum and/or staff development experiences.
- (2) Project Proposal: <u>Download the Project Proposal form</u> from

and complete the required questions. Tell us why you would like to participate in this Study Tour and how you will use what you learn from the program. Quality and originality are key elements in the selection process. Please also outline a timeline of activities related to your project to be scheduled

from September 2026 - June 2027. You are encouraged to disseminate information to audiences beyond individual schools such as district-wide teacher resource centers, community or professional organizations. Local Japan-America Societies may be of assistance for community-wide dissemination efforts. (www.us-japan.org)

(3) Letter of Employment: A letter from your employer, which attests to your full time professional status for the 2026-2027 school-year.

(4) Letters of Recommendation:

Two letters to support for applicants' participation in the tour from administrators and/or key individuals.

2. Submission

After gathering all above documents, please visit https://www.us-japan.org/kkc to apply for the KKC Study Tour by the aforementioned deadline. All documents must be submitted online. Submitted application documents become the property of the KKC and cannot be returned.

A special committee will select and notify each fellow in writing on <u>March 27, 2026</u>.
